Dear friends in Christ, for five weeks of Lent we have been preparing, by works of charity and self-sacrifice, for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. Today we come together to begin the solemn celebration in union with the whole Church throughout the world. Christ entered in triumph into His own city, to complete His work as our Messiah: to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us remember with devotion this entry, which began His saving work and follow Him with a lively faith. United with Him in His suffering on the Cross, may we share His resurrection and new life.

Blessing of the Palms:

Almighty God, we pray you bless + these branches and make them holy. Today we joyfully acclaim Jesus our Messiah and King. May we reach one day the happiness of the new and everlasting Jerusalem by faithfully following Him who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Gospel Reading: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke *All* **Glory to you, O Lord.** *Luke* 19:28-40

²⁸ Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, ³⁰ 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this, "The Lord needs it." ³² So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' ³⁴ They said, 'The Lord needs it.' ³⁵ Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he rode along, people kept

their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷ As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying,

³⁸ 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!' ³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' ⁴⁰ He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'

Narrator First thing in the morning, the chief priest together with the elders and

scribes, in short the whole Sanhedrin, had their plan ready. They had Jesus bound and took him away and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate

questioned him,

Pilate Are you the king of the Jews?

Narrator He answered,

Jesus It is you who say it,

Narrator The chief priests brought many accusations against him. Pilate

questioned him again,

Pilate Have you no reply at all? See how many accusations they are bringing

against you!

Narrator But to Pilate's amazement, Jesus made no further reply. At festival time

Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone they asked for. Now a

man called Barabbas was then in prison with the rioters who had

committed murder during the uprising. When the crowd went up and

began to ask Pilate the customary favour, Pilate answered them,

Pilate Do you want me to release for you the king of the Jews?

Narrator For he realised it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed

Jesus over. The chief priests, however, had incited the crowd to demand that he should release Barabbas for them instead. Then Pilate spoke

again.

Pilate But in that case, what am I to do with the man you call king of the Jews?

Narrator They shouted back,

All Crucify him!

Narrator Pilate asked them,

Pilate Why? What harm has he done?

Narrator But they shouted all the louder,

All Crucify him!

Narrator So Pilate, anxious to placate the crowd, released Barabbas for them and,

having ordered Jesus to be scourged, handed him over to be crucified. The soldiers led him away to the inner part of the palace, that is, the Praetorium, and called the whole cohort together. They dressed him up in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on him. And they

began saluting him,

All Hail, king of the Jews!

Narrator

They struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and they went down on their knees to do him homage. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple and dressed him in his own clothes.

They led him out to crucify him. They enlisted a passer by, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of the skull. They offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he refused it. Then they crucified him, and shared out his clothing, casting lots to decide what each should get. It was the third hour when they crucified him. The inscription giving the charge against him read: 'The King of the Jews.' And they crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left. The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said,

All Aha! So you would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days! Then save yourself: come down from the cross!

Narrator The chief priests and the scribes mocked him among themselves in the same way. They said,

All He saved others, he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the king of Israel, come down from the cross now, for us to see it and believe.

Narrator Even those who were crucified with him taunted him. When the sixth hour came there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice,

Jesus Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?

Narrator This means

Jesus "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?"

Narrator When some of those who stood by heard this, they said,

All Listen, he is calling on Elijah.

Narrator Someone ran and soaked a sponge in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink, saying, "Wait and see if Elijah will come to take him down." But Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The centurion, who was standing in front of him, had seen how he had died, and he said, "In

truth this man was the Son of God."

This is the Passion of Christ.

Maundy Thursday (March 28th)

7.30pm Sung Communion

and Gethsemane Watch until Midnight

"Maundy" comes from "Mandatum" which means "command". We explore three particular commands of love, given by Jesus at the Last Supper:

Do this in remembrance of me.....celebrating the gift of Holy Communion that Jesus gave us on this very holy night.

You also ought to wash one another's feet..... We focus on Jesus washing his disciple's feet (a profound sign of humility and service).

Could you not watch with me one hour

The vigil of silent prayer until midnight is a reminder of Jesus's agony and time of anguished prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, and a chance for us to obey (fully, or for a shorter or longer time) this command.

Towards the end of the main service, and in preparation for the stark solemnity of Good Friday, altars can be stripped, and some church ornamentation removed or covered.

Extra Communion wafers are consecrated to provide "Reserved Sacrament" for two purposes: to allow a simple sharing of Communion on Good Friday, and to be carried to a place in church to become a focus for the Vigil evoking Gethsemane. You are invited to stay until the silent Gethsemane watch has begun......and then leave whenever you like (after a few minutes.....after any length of time you choose......or at Midnight(!) You could also go home and return later; or if you are not coming to the service, you could still drop in for part (or all) of the Vigil. In a previous parish I got to know a man who ONLY came to church once a year – to this silent vigil – not even to the service that came before it. He loved this bittersweet time of silence and reflection......

Good Friday (March 29th)

2.00pm The Service of the Cross

(Also called "The Liturgy of Good Friday")

This includes a "Passion Gospel", reflections on the meaning of the Cross; the Veneration of the cross (an opportunity – for those who wish – to make a very simple act of devotion to Christ crucified) and an opportunity to receive the bread of Holy Communion from the specially Reserved Sacrament (see Maundy Thursday).

Easter Sunday (March 31st) 6.00am Easter Ceremonies

This service is based on the Easter baptismal ceremonies of the early church, which went on for many hours and through the night. If we were to do the full version, which has been used in the modern church for some years, it can take several hours......but this "pared down" version is about 45 to 60 minutes.

It begins with a small fire outside (the "New Fire") symbolizing the beginning of the Resurrection. The Easter candle is lit from the fire and carried into the church. Individual candles (which we hold) can be lit from the Easter Candle, to show that we can share in Christ's light. By candlelight, there is the singing of an ancient Easter hymn, the "Exsultet". There are then some bible readings, tracing God's liberating acts in scripture...... then all the lights come on and there is an explosion of sound to celebrate the resurrection. It is called "The Joyful Noise" and you can bring bells, whistles, drums, football rattles...... anything like that(!) The remainder of the service includes the renewal of baptismal vows at the font (by candlelight) and a Communion from the Peace onwards.......

A service in traditional language, celebrating the Risen Christ!

10.00am All-Age Sung Communion

A modern language service, celebrating the Risen Christ!
